Events were held in Belgrave at the Community Centre on Feb 18<sup>th</sup>, and at the Blyth and District Community Centre and the North Huron Wescast Community Complex on Feb 19th. The event is a fundraiser for the North Huron Food Share, and food items and donations were collected as admission to the events. #### **Blyth Memorial Community Hall**

Staff have been working to investigate the cause of the excessively large icicles that built up on Blyth Memorial Community Hall during the very cold weather over December and January. Attached is a report from the architect. The estimated cost of the fix and consulting is around \$25,000. This amount has been placed in the 2018 budget, and will draw from the project reserve to cover the expense. More details need to be worked through to confirm the project approach and costs, but at this time Council is receiving the initial report for information purposes.

### Richard W LeVan Airport Study

Staff met with the Huron County Economic Development department, representatives from the Town of Goderich, and Explorer Solutions to review the report's recommendations and next steps. The report will be presented to the North Huron Economic Development Committee at their meeting on April 5, 2018.

### Friends of the Village of Blyth

Staff met with the representative of this volunteer organization to review their work plan for 2018. The volunteers have an ambitious plan to revitalize Horticultural Park in Blyth. They have also worked with staff to order the new bench and flower planter for Blyth. They continue to support the gardens, park spaces, and trail in Blyth and plan to attend an upcoming Council meeting in April to share their work plan for Council's approval.

#### **North Huron Food Booths**

At the February budget meeting, North Huron Council directed staff to close the food booth service at the Blyth and Wingham facilities. Staff working at the booth have received notification of the closure, and the booth staff are not ordering any more food for the booth, unless it can be used in the vending machines after the booth closes. The booth equipment and infrastructure will be thoroughly cleaned and unplugged, and left intact and any equipment under contract will be returned to the venders.

### **Huron Pioneer Threshers Campground Agreement**

Staff met with representatives of the Huron Pioneer Threshers organization on February 15. The next meeting is scheduled for March 16 to allow time for the Threshers organization to hold their meeting to discuss the agreement.

### Alice Munro Public Library (Wingham Library)

This facility was broken into on Sunday January 28th. The change box was taken with less than \$20 in value. The cost to repair the broken glass door was \$246.18 plus labour. Wingham Police have made arrests associated with this crime.

#### March Ice

This season both Wingham and Blyth have bookings that will keep the ice in until at least March 26<sup>th</sup>. The Blyth and Brussels arenas switch annually to keep ice in after the first Monday in March. This year the Blyth ice is kept in to host Blyth Brussels Minor Hockey. Also there is a charity hockey game planned for Saturday March 24<sup>th</sup> at 2:00pm. Huron County Victim Services is hosting a charity hockey game between the First Responders. The Wingham arena at the NHWCC is hosting the WOAA Girls Year End Hockey Tournament from March 23-25. Staff will assess bookings after March 25 to confirm ice out date at each arena. The WOAA tournament is an excellent opportunity for local businesses to enjoy many visitors to Wingham over the weekend.

### **Retirement Notification**
